From Program Creator and Humane Society of Washington County, Inc. Volunteer Karol Kennedy:

During our years of growing up in Southern California, many cats and dogs, monkeys, ducks, rabbits, rats and lizards, parrots and parakeets found a place in our home. The route to the door always varied...often they "followed us home.", which my mother always pretended to believe, no matter how young, injured or small the find might be.

Orphans, be they kitten, baby cotton tail rabbit or fallen sparrow, always found a nurturing welcome; sometimes in a cotton lined shoebox, warmed by the stove's pilot light. A stray cat always found food. Mom religiously carted "doggie bags" home or sometimes no farther than a restaurant parking lot if she observed a hungry stray there.

Her childhood dream was to be a librarian and live in a houseful of purring cats. In her later years, one special cat, "Hi", as she dubbed the stray who wandered up to her door one morning, was her companion for a decade. He was her reason to rise in the morning. She did not turn in for the night until he was safely inside and purring at the foot of her bed.

Our family knows from personal experience the companionship and pleasure that a pet can bring, particularly to a lonely senior citizen. However, many of our senior citizens are hard put to provide for their own nutritional and medical needs. Stretching limited resources to care for a pet can be a bridge too far.
